This segment has multiple lines that literally mean the same thing. He just can't figure her out, she's spontaneous, random, and unpredictable. Even though this may be the case he accepts that and knows it will all work out as planned.

**My head's under water  
But I'm breathing fine  
You're crazy and I'm out of my mind**

This screams invulnerability, immortality, immunity, or whatever word you want to use. His love is so strong that he's able to face things head on without harm.

The acknowledgment that there's probably something nutty about the both of them is smile worthy.
